Project Eligibility Requirements

- Please see 2024 Call for Power RFP <u>Table 1</u> and addenda for eligibility requirements.
- Each Project will be assessed for the 9 requirements, based on Schedules 2-4.
- The outcome will be a pass/fail per Proposal.



Project Proposal Requirements

Section 7.0

The Proponent's Proposal consists of these items:

- Proposal Fee
- Schedule 2: Commercial Proposal Form
- Schedule 3: Project Information Requirements
- Schedule 4: First Nations Consultation and Economic Participation
- Schedule 5: Financial Information Requirements
- Schedule 6: Relationship Disclosure Form
- Bid Security



Proposal Fee

Section 7.0

- Proposal Fee in the amount of \$13,000 per Proposal must be received
- Invoices and payment instructions will be provided by BC Hydro to the contact as stated in your Proposal
- Due date for Proposal Fee will be extended to after September
 23, 2024
- Multiple Proposals must submit a separate Proposal Fee for each
 Proposal

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Schedules

General instructions

- Ensure you complete all fields
- Complete the header in each Schedule and Form:

CEAP Interconnection Request Number	

- Each Schedule should be saved as its own file
- Follow the numbering system in the Schedule
- Exhibits should be numbered sequentially and tabbed at the end of each Schedule
- Use Forms as noted
- Include a Table of Contents

Proposal Submission Requirements

- Reminders:

 - Include Project Name, Proponent Name and CEAP
 Interconnection Request Number on each Schedule
- Review Addenda and Q&As
- If any submission requirements are unclear, send an email.
- Deadline to submit RFP Q&As to BC Hydro is September 5, 2024



Proposal Submission Requirements

- One Proposal per Project
- Proposals must be submitted electronically
- All Proposals must be submitted by 4 pm on September 16, 2024 per Section 4.4 - RFP Schedule
 - Late submissions will not be considered



Proposal Submission Requirements

- Proposals may be submitted prior to September 16th
 - Revisions are accepted prior to Closing Time
- Obligation to Inform of BC Hydro of Material Changes
 - Refer to Section 8.6 for details on what constitutes a Material Change



Electronic Submission Updates

- RFP 20329 titled "BC Hydro Call for Power States 2024" currently states that the submission location is 2024call@bchydro.com.
- We are introducing a submission option for those who wish to use it in particular with those with files that exceed of the 20 MB email size limit.
- BC Hydro will be using ShareFile as an option for accepting application documents.
- The Primary Contact that you submitted in Schedule 1 will receive instructions and the credentials on how to submit the proposal using ShareFile.
- Proponents may submit all, some, or no documents through ShareFile and email submission will remain an option for documents under 20MB.

NOTE: THE ShareFile Platform is only available for access in the US and Canada.
