

Construction Notice – Electrical Upgrade Work Fraser Highway at Pacific Highway 15 (176 Street), Surrey

November 27, 2024

We're working closely with the Surrey Langley SkyTrain Project team to accommodate the rapid transit extension from Surrey to Langley. This work includes the installation of a duct bank to accommodate the relocation of power lines from the north side of Fraser Highway to the south side.

A duct bank is a series of plastic conduits encased in concrete that house and protect underground cables.

Where: Fraser Highway at Pacific Highway 15 (176 Street) and west to Serpentine River in Surrey.

When: Anticipated to start December 1 with targeted completion by mid-December.

Working Hours: Overnight, Monday to Saturday from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m.

This work requires temporary traffic pattern changes. Traffic will be reduced to a single lane, in each direction along Fraser Highway.

Safety is our top priority. Sidewalks, bike lanes and bus stops on this route will be impacted and may not be available. Please follow the onsite signage provided by TransLink and the direction of the crew on site.

Drivers are advised to plan ahead and expect delays. Please reduce speed in the construction zone and follow the directions of traffic control personnel and posted signage. Cyclists are advised to look for <u>alternative bike routes</u> while the work is underway along Fraser Highway. <u>https://www.surrey.ca/cycling</u>
